#### Book 1

- 4 Thetis makes her appeal to Zeus
- 5 | Quarrel among the gods

## Book 24

#### Read up

- 5 Burning and funeral of Hektor in Troy
- 4 Reconciliation; Akhilleus returns Hektor
- *b Priam visits Akhilleus with treasure*
- 3 Thetis gives Zeus's command to Akhilleus
- a Thetis visits Akhilleus, who is lamenting
- 2 Zeus makes his command to Thetis
- 1 Quarrel among the gods

*Note*: The poem was divided into twenty-four books a few centuries after it was composed, but many of the divisions correspond to breaks in the narrative. The events in books 1 and 24 are notably symmetrical.
