

Copy Footnotes and Endnotes to a Separate Document

Q: Angela Ash's article in the July '96 issue explains how to place endnotes at the bottom of each chapter. How can I place the endnotes all in a separate file? – Jeffrey L. Sammons, New Haven, CT

A: WordPerfect doesn't have a feature to place endnotes or footnotes in a separate file. But, if you use the included COPYNOTE.WPM macro, you can copy endnotes or footnotes and then place them into a separate file.

To use the macro, make sure Document 2 is blank, then open the document with the endnotes or footnotes into Document 1. Press Play Macro (Alt-F10), type "copynote" and press (Enter). The macro asks whether you want to copy footnotes or endnotes. Choose one, and the macro copies the text of the endnotes or footnotes to another document screen.
